How it works?

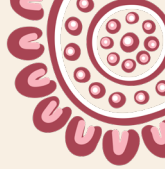
1. Tell us about your workplace challenge (something you want to change).

4. Embed your new knowledge and solution-based learning into your workplace and keep the connection going.

Who can apply?

You must identify as an Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander to apply and be in a managerial or equivalent position in an aged care or Aboriginal Community Controlled Health Organisation (ACCHO). You need to be working in a role that can embed the solution back into the workplace. Funding for backfill will be negotiated with your organisation to support you to participate.

How do I apply?

Scan the QR code or click the Apply Now link on the other side of this flyer. Fill in the details, outline the issue you want to solve and submit your application by 11:59pm (ACDT) on Sunday 11 January 2026.

Where can I go for my Knowledge Exchange Visit?

You can approach any national aged care organisation that has proven expertise in the area you are looking to improve to see if they are willing to partner with you.

What does the partner organisation need to do to participate?

Once you have identified a partner organisation, ARIIA staff will contact them to discuss their process, ensure they have an appropriate mentor and sign a standard agreement. They will receive support and funding from ARIIA as your partner.

I want to participate, and I have an idea of an issue I'd like to address but I don't know who to approach.

Outline your issue in the application and we will reach out to our industry contacts to see if we can find you an appropriate match.

What if I must travel interstate / a significant distance for the Knowledge Exchange Visit?

The Knowledge Exchange Visit can start as early as February 2026 and must be completed by 30 April 2026.
